If you ordered tags for State Fair Sheep & Goats, validation is scheduled for June 29 at 6:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds. Please mark your calendars for this date to get your animals tagged.

Please remember that validation does not mean that your animal has been entered in the show. An entry process is still required at a later date.

Remember to Update 4-H Enrollment—August 1

September 1, 2011 marks the beginning of the 2011-2012 year in 4-H. Therefore, every 4-H member will need to go on 4-H connect to re-enroll at http://texas4-h.tamu.edu/. The earliest date to re-enroll in 4-H is August 1, 2011 for the new year. Please note that after **August 31**, everyone is switched to inactive on the computer and Grimes County 4-H enrollment goes to zero.

Be aware that your meetings for the Fair should not be counted until you are officially enrolled. Let's all work together to make sure that everyone is enrolled as soon as possible. For families without internet access at home please contact Sandra Curl at (936)-873-3907 so that we can get you enrolled in a timely manner. Our enrollment is online. Therefore, completing a paper enrollment form is **NOT** necessary. However, your 4-H club manager might ask for information in order to be able to contact members and parents by mail and phone.

July 18-21, 2011 Texas A&M University Beef Center

The Texas 4-H Livestock Ambassador Program will equip youth with the knowledge and skills to become ambassadors for Texas AgriLife Extension Service, the Texas 4-H program and animal science as it relates to livestock projects.

The short course will be college level animal science curriculum. It will take an in-depth look at sheep, goat, swine, and cattle production in Texas and how it relates to the show ring.

A <u>4-H Livestock Ambassador</u> is an outstanding student that has completed the 4-H Livestock Ambassador Short Course and is willing to assist 4-H families in their counties with their livestock projects.

The students will be required to log at least 30 hours of service annually helping novice 4-H'ers with their livestock project and educating fellow 4-H'ers. The program is designed for youth wanting to enhance their livestock production their livestock production knowledge and leadership
